We have a small **fund** to help with registration fees and we do not want any youth to miss out on the Scouting experience due to financial needs. The Midnight Sun Council has taken steps to keep the cost of Scouting down in many ways, in order to assist families so they can enjoy the Scouting program. Though now allowed by the National office, we do NOT charge program fees (which could be equal to but not exceed registration fees), up front activity fees (pay in advance for all district and council level activities), and insurance fees. We have camperships available for our Cub Scout Day Camp and Scouts BSA Summer Camp. We also host an "experienced" uniform bank. This is why our annual popcorn sale and Family Friends of Scouting campaigns are so important. These fundraisers help us to continue to provide the above services to our Scouting families.

Youth Protection Updates for 9/1/2023

Effective September 1, 2023: Councils and camps must ensure that all programs meet the new NCAP requirements as of September 1, 2023.

Highlights include:

• All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered as an adult volunteer or adult program participant. Registration as a Merit Badge Counselor **does not** satisfy this requirement.

• There is a limited exception for Cub Scout parents staying overnight with their

child/ward, (meaning that they can without being registered).
