



Friends of Scouting

We have officially kicked off the Friends of Scouting (FOS) or referred to by our Council "Fund the Adventure" campaign season.



We introduce the theme of the Klondike Derby featured on the patch and coin design depicting youth participating in a Klondike Derby competition. Keeping with the theme of a dog mushing sled carrying vital supplies long distances as our Scouts have this year.

Our volunteer board has similarly themed their campaign with the famous 1925 serum run that delivered desperately needed serum to Nome. Their goal is to raise the much-needed funding (serum) of \$60,000 to the Midnight Sun Council operating fund that supports over 10,000 youth annually. This is a friendly competition to get our teams sledding down the path to Nome, where we need to deliver much needed vials of serum (funding). Leading each of their 4 sled teams are famous sled dogs (team names) Togo, Fox, Balto and Granite. Will history repeat itself when Balto gets to the finish first or will teams Togo, Fox or Granite get there first??

We only show amounts given to the board campaign here, most board members also contribute to individual Units or sponsor fundraising events. Not showing are those amounts that were given to a district and/or unit level, as they get accounted for in a different campaign.



Youth Protection Training (YPT)



As part of the BSA's goal to become the National Leader in Youth Safety there are some changes coming to Youth Protection Training. The Unit Key-3 will no longer be able to edit the YPT dates. As of March 4th, 2024, the BSA will be requiring that the Criminal Background Check is completed before you can become an active adult leader.

Units that are rechartering, should encourage their leadership to check on and update their YPT if it has been at least a year since they last completed it. Remember that this can be done individually or the leadership can set up a training date for their unit to complete it all at the same time. Please remember that if your unit does their Youth Protection Training as a unit to turn in a Training Attendance report to the Council with the updated information. As a reminder the Midnight Sun Council requires our adult leaders and merit badge counselors to complete their YPT yearly.

Please check your YPT training as some members are past the one year date required by the Midnight Sun Council.

Good morning, my name is Andrew Johnson and I am the Alaska State Advocate for the Leave No Trace Center. I am a Member of the Eagle class of 1992, and my son is a member of the Eagle class of 2023. I have been involved in the Leave No Trace community for just under 10 years in Arizona, Georgia, the United Kingdom, and now here in Alaska. I also currently run the Leave No Trace Alaska Facebook page as part of my role as

the State Advocate (<https://www.facebook.com/profile.php?id=100069079574875>).

As the Council Outdoor Ethics Advocate for the Great Alaska Council, I have worked hard with troops, crews, packs, and scouters to recognize the value of the program, especially with the renewed emphasis in the cub scout adventure program as well as with Scouting rank requirements. I'm sure we agree that having trained adults provides for a better program and there is an opportunity coming up in August.

Our regional director for Outdoor Ethics, Daryl Krossman, informed me that there is an LNT level 2 Instructor course (formerly known as a Master Educator) at Camp Pioneer in Oregon running from 10-15 August. The cost is \$275, for which there is a scholarship available. Transportation would be up to the individual to get to Portland. Registration closes at the end of July.
