

Youth Protection Training (YPT)



As part of the BSA's goal to become the National Leader in Youth Safety there are some changes coming to Youth Protection Training. The Unit Key-3 will no longer be able to edit the YPT dates. As of March 4th, 2024, the BSA will be requiring that the Criminal Background Check is completed before you can become an active adult leader.

Units that are rechartering, should encourage their leadership to check on and update their YPT if it has been at least a year since they last completed it. Remember that this can be done

individually or the leadership can set up a training date for their unit to complete it all at the same time. Please remember that if your unit does their Youth Protection Training as a unit to turn in a Training Attendance report to the Council with the updated information. This form is available at the Council office, and can be picked up or emailed to you.

As a reminder the Midnight Sun Council requires our adult leaders and merit badge counselors to complete their YPT yearly.

Please check your YPT training as some members are past the one year date required by the Midnight Sun Council.

Boating Safety Alert

May 29, 2024 An National Water Safety Month in May draws to a close, it's crucial for everyone in Sociating to continue to focus on facilitating safe aquatics programs this summer. A few recent incidents serve as reminders of the ever-present need or wiglance.

- review the following Boating Safety Alert Information and share with uting units, camp staff and volunteers immediately: Ensure the principles of <u>Safe Swim Defense</u> and <u>Safety Afloat</u> are always
- Leverage the annual swim check process to ensure everyone is prepared to participate based on their swim classification (nonswimmer, beginner, swimmer). Review Aquatics Supervision Checks 5 for details.
- Per Safety Afloat Principle III4, "Property fitted life jackets with U.S. Coast Guard approval for th activity must be worn by all persons while boating."
- b) Utilize the Buddy System (see Safety Afloat Principle #5 and Safe Swim Defense Principle #7). All participants in an activity afloat are paired as buddles who are always aware of each other's situation and prepared to sound an alarm and lend assistance immediately when needed.
- Perview Aquatics Supervision Chapter 2 prior to facilitating swimming activities from boats.
 Reminder swimming from a boat under way is not authorized.
 If Scouts are towed behind or allowed to swim from the boat, then the engine must be turned of thorized to pay on the pay of the water.
- tumou or prior to expose entening, or reaving, or waves. For two sports, there must be a beignated observer or lookout in addition to a qualified boart operator (see chapter 28 "few Sports" of Aquatics Supervision"). That person and the boart operator will be thin values interpret the water entering wound the boart and confirm by headcound during a budgy check that everyone in the party is either securely on board or will clear of the propulsion system before the angles in e-tarted.
- 6) Reminder Motorboats may be operated by youth, subject to state requirements, only whe accompanied in the boat by an experienced leader or camp staff member who meets state requirements for motorboat operation.

From Scouting's Commitment to Safety, "In Scouting, we will not compromise the safety of or youth, volunteers, and employees. Safety is a value that must be taught and reinforced at eve opportunity. We are all responsible and must hold each other accountable to provide a safe environment for all participants."

The essay contest encourages young minds to examine America's history, along with their own experiences in modern American society, by drafting a 300- to 400-word essay, expressing their views based on a patriotic theme chosen by the VFW Commander-in-Chief.

NESA Update 2024




