<u>SAFETY CORNER!</u>

Reminder: Scouting's Barrier to Abuse: "72 Hour Rule"

There are no changes at this time. The current policy and one source of truth can be found in the <u>Guide to</u> <u>Safe Scouting</u> which states: "All adults accompanying a Scouting unit who are present at the activity for 72 total hours or more must be registered as leaders. The 72 hours need not be consecutive." <u>READ</u> <u>MORE</u>
