
UAF Sledding Hill (UAF Nanook Recreation)

here in the interior of Alaska embody the spirit of living the scout law and oath.

Mark began his Scouting career in 1978 as a Cub Scout in Pack 152 in Follansbee, WV with the Fort Steuben Area Council. He earned his Arrow of Light crossing over to Troop 152, where he climbed to the rank of Life Scout before leaving Scouts and pursuing his dream of becoming a firefighter. Mark joined the US Air Force and served for 21 years as a firefighter, retiring in 2010. In 2015, Mark's wife, April, was reassigned to Eielson AFB and it was there that their son, Liam joined Cub Scout Pack 9. With a departure of all but 1 adult leader, Mark took on the role of Cub Master. Mark served as the CM for 3 years and was awarded the Unit Leader Award of Merit. He and his family moved from Eielson to Fairbanks and Mark took on the role of Cub Master yet again, but this time with Pack 92 and with his daughters joining the Pack. One year later, as his son bridged out of Cub Scouts and into Scouts BSA, Mark and Liam moved to Troop 20 where Mark became Asst. Scoutmaster with the boy Troop and Advancement Chair with the girl Troop. He assumed the role of Scoutmaster of Troop 20 in 2021. In all, Mark has served 13 years with the BSA as a Scout and a Scouter
