It also is permissible for a local church to celebrate on the Sunday most acceptable to the pastor and congregation.

FROM THE REGISTRAR

There are some changes to our registration process starting March 1st

2024 Membership Fee & Application Update

There will be a 3-5 day minimum delay in the acceptance of Adult Leaders. They must pass a background check PRIOR to them serving as a leader or volunteering. This will have a major impact on rechartering units, camp leaders, and new units. Effective March 1, 2024, the BSA will eliminate the \$25 one-time joining fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting.

- \$85/yr for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants (\$5 increase)
- \$65/yr for all adult volunteers (\$5 increase)
- \$30/vr for Scoutreach (No change in fee
- \$25/yr for Merit Badge Counselors (No change in fee. Only for Merit Badge Counselors not already registered as leaders)
- \$50/yr for Exploring participants Youth & Adult (No change in fee)
- \$100/yr unit renewal/affiliation fee (No change in fee)
- \$15/yr for Scout Life magazine (No change in fee)

Youth Protection Training (YPT)

As part of the BSA's goal to become the National Leader in Youth Safety there are some changes coming to Youth Protection Training. The Unit Key-3 will no longer be able to edit the YPT dates. The BSA will be requiring that the Criminal Background Check is completed before you can become an active adult leader. This will have a release date of March 1st, 2024.

Units that are rechartering, should encourage their leadership to check on and update their YPT if it has been at least a year since they last completed it. Remember that this can be done individually or the leadership can set up a training date for their unit to complete it all at the same time. Please remember that if your unit does their Youth Protection Training as a unit to turn in a Training Attendance report to the Council with the updated information. This form is available at the Council office, and can be picked up or emailed to you.

As a reminder the Midnight Sun Council requires our adult leaders and merit badge

counselors to complete their YPT yearly

Save the Date for NESA Scholarship Application Window

December 1st the National Eagle Scout Association (NESA) starts accepting applications from eligible for the 2024 scholarship season. In 2023, NESA granted scholarships to 69 NESA members awarding over \$520,000 in funds. Help spread the word and secure scholarships for Eagle Scouts in your council!

Applicants can join here and visit nesa.org/scholarships/ to learn more about how to apply.

Application Requirements:

- Eagle Board of Review date must be before January 24, 2024
- Eagle Scout must be a member of the National Eagle Scout Association
- May apply for scholarships beginning in senior year of high school through junior year in an undergraduate program or by the halfway point of an associate degree program or skilled trade program

Applications must be completed and submitted by 11:5p p.m. CST on January 31, 2024


